Among the five officers elected and installed for the upcoming year are two rather new members; Mike Rodgers and David Kerth, President and Vice President, respectively. The three other positions went to former officers. Mike Evans moved from Secretary to Vice President (Activities), Red Badgett from President to Secretary, and Marilyn Ozenbaugh remains as Treasurer.

It's good to see new members step to the fore and want to help move the club forward.

While we have enough members to keep the officers in line with the club's rules, it's nice to have a mix of returning Board members familiar with club rules to keep board meetings on agenda and from presenting issues to the General Membership that may run afoul of the Bylaws.

Because the December meeting was, as usual, brief and dealt with the elections, subjects that came to members minds weren't formally discussed. But an issue regarding the election process did come up that will merit discussion before the next election; and since any change in that process would probably necessitate a Standing Rules change, the "before" means in the next month or so.

In the past, an installation took place separately from the election count. That seemed to be more festive. We can work on that and other events with the Activities Vice President and membership.

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Putting the Green in Greenbrier

For a while now Jim Stansbury's neighbor, Joe, of has been over to The Barn talking about electric vehicles.

Joe is a member of the Electric Vehicle Association of San Diego (EVAOSD) ~ an organization of folks going about converting perfectly good carbonizers into battery powered things. He's been eyeing Jim's '65 for a while now.

But, this last week the club was offered a 1961 Greenbrier. Jim Stansbury and I went to look at it in El Cajon, and trailered it back to his place with the intent of selling for the club. (We had actually posted it on the Corvair Center in a blind bid auction) Then Joe saw it.

He looked it over, up and down, in and out, then declared it to be a perfect vehicle for going green. That the van has a bad clutch, leaks oil a bit and, at best, has a collapsed lifter, or a dropped seat doesn't really concern him. It has some rust holes in the roof and other usual places, but it is a nice looking van with potential. The dash is now a 100 mph (car) and the steer is out of a car, also.

After some negotiating, Jim and I decided to donate the van to his cause with an agreement that he post a notice on the van that it was provided by the club ~ and we get the running gear.

I guess he's excited because he started right into weights and batteries. Costs, efficiency and weights of lead acid versus lithium. Wanted to know curb weights, payloads and other such plus or minus things that Jim will provide him with. These things are expensive to convert ~ I think, even more than it cost to build Hot Aire.

I remember that presentation at one of the club meetings several years ago by Dr. Jalal Salihi on GM's Electrovair, a project began in1963, using a 1964 body and chassis (Electrovair I) and later in a '66 (Electrovair II). Those vehicles used silverzinc batteries. Think what 40 years of battery and control advancement could have on the Electrovair. Maybe we'll see it in the EV

Greenbrier. And hopefully it will be on display at either this year's Toss, Cruisin' Grand or next year's Toss. I do know the EVAOSD has a display of club cars at the San Diego Auto Show now running at the Convention Center.

A little history on the van: It began as a (okay, here I'm guessing a bit ~ the original color looks to be the same as my '63 Brier was) 905 Jade, Meadow, Laurel, Seafoam, Ivy green. Now it's a powdering off silver ~ not primer as it appears. The wheels are lighter and bluer than the color under the flaked off silver. But they are FC wheels.



It was once owned by Frank Seibenborn who sold it to the donor, who in turn used it as his daily driver for 5 or 6 years until the van developed its engine problems. So, why get rid of it? He likes using his '64 140 coupe as his daily driver, now, and he'd rather put his efforts into rebuilding the other 140 coupe in his garage.

But, he does have a couple of other FC parts in his garage he wants to sell: a set of bucket seats for an FC (in need of upholstery) and a pair of NOS rear wheel bearings— Delco Hyatt 7451321—for an FC. He's asking \$150 for the seats, \$300 for the pair of bearings.
