# Cover Story 2009 RON FUNDERBERG ECONOMY RUN

Well after a few extremely stressful months of intense planning and preparation, we hosted the 2009 Ron Funderberg Economy Run on Saturday June 20th. Weather was cool and overcast actually even a bit of drizzle along the coast.

Corvair driving conditions. Our planning goal was to have 20 vehicles registered, and we came close as 19



drivers arrived at the starting point. Unfortunately, 1 Corvair had to bow out prior to start for mechanical reasons, while 2 drivers left the route early for personal reasons - thus, 16 spirited and highly competitive drivers completed the route.



A new course was introduced this year, covering approximately 66 miles across south Orange County. The route combined open stretches of road with some good hills and some of OC's best rural and ocean views.

good spot for me to acknowledge the well-deserved shots I took for a couple of directional gaffes after exiting Laguna Canyon Road - my apologies. If it's any consolation, I

Mike Ramos spotted this early 2-door at the corner of 11106 Mac Duff St. and Adah St. in Graden Grove off Katella Ave.





1960-61 Brakes are the same.

- 1962 Placement and change of master cylinder. Two different master cylinders: One for regular brake shoes (1" bore) and one for metallic shoes (7/8" bore). New brake shoes and anchor pins.
- 1963 Self adjusters were added. New springs and self adjuster parts were added, Brake shoes, wheel cylinders and master cylinders same as 1962
- 1964 New finned brake drums and backing plates. All parts same as 1963

By changing the anchor pins on the 1960-61 and brake shoes, you can install self adjuster brakes. Look at 1963-64 for a list of parts.

1964 front brake drums only will fit 1964. You could change the front backing plate. 1964 rear brake drums will fit all early cars.

Upgrading master cylinder to dual on 1962-64, kits are available. Thanks to Bob Nichols who helped some change to dual master cylinder.

There are front disc kits available if you want better brakes.

You can install front spindles from 1965-69 if you want bigger brakes. This will also let you add 5 lugs wheels to the front. The rear axles and drums will have to be drilled for 5 lugs.

If I have missed anything let me know.


July 7, 1959 - The first production Corvairs are built and begin rolling down the Willow Run assembly line.
